General Data Protection Regulations

The British Briard Club is a non-profit making organisation.

To comply with the legislation on data protection we must tell you the personal data we hold about you, why we hold it and have your permission to retain it. We securely store data about members to ensure that we can contact members by post, telephone or email.

For the smooth and efficient running of your Club we need to keep a record of:-

- Your name
- o Your address
- Your landline and/or mobile telephone number(s)
- Your email address

This information is stored securely on paper or a removable data storage device and not on a computer.

The data is only held to inform members about the activities and meetings of the Club, including Show schedules, the Club magazine (The Double Dew Claw), Notices of and from the AGM and Judges Lists.

Any data we hold will not be provided to any other person or business for any reason, except as may be required by a governing body. (Kennel Club or Law)

You may request to see all the personal data we hold on you (by law we are allowed 30 days to produce and supply this information to you).

We only keep your data for the reasons outlined above. If you do not wish the Club to hold your data, either on paper or a secure computer record, please inform the Secretary and your data will be deleted, however we will no longer be able to send you any Members' mailings.

As a Member we retain your data until we are informed that you no longer wish to remain as a Member or are informed that you are deceased. In turn, it is your responsibility to inform us of any changes to your address or circumstances, to ensure the data held is accurate.
